## **Recreation Association Review**

Wendy updated the Board on the Rec. Association and pool operation. The memberships were down from 2014 but other income came from selling \$5-per-visit cards and from concessions. Upcoming repairs include crumbling cinderblock below the clubhouse, pump replacement, diving board replacement, and replacing rotted beams around the pool and the tiles that cover them.

## **Budget for 2016**

The Board discussed two options for the **2016** budget. Steve moved that we approve the budget with annual dues of \$155; motion carried unanimously.

## **Architectural Review**

Steve briefed the Board on violations which have been corrected and several requests for tree removal.

## **Open Forum**

Ted reported that the State Adopt-a-Highway program requires two clean-up activities per year. Steve moved that the Board authorize funds not to exceed \$100 for the refreshments and landfill coupons for the next community clean-up day on Oct. 10, which is scheduled from 10:00 AM to noon. The motion carried unanimously.
